

PUKE ARIKI AND COMMUNITY LIBRARIES SUMMER READING PROGRAMME

Terms and conditions

- New Plymouth District Council, through Puke Ariki (the **Council**) is giving away prizes for reading during our summer reading programme.
- Children aged 6 years and over are invited to take part in the reading programme.
 - Participants will pick up a booklet from their library (*or download & print if available*)
 - Participants will read three books and fill in the activity booklet with 2-3 activities.
 - Participants will drop their completed activity booklets off at their library to go in the prize draw.
 - Prizes will be drawn during the first week of February.
- Prizes may include books or activity packs.
- Entry is open to children aged 6-12 years.
- The programme begins on 1 December 2025 and runs through until 31 January. Participants can pick up their booklet anytime during this period.
- Participants can pick up further booklets and enter multiple times.
- Completed entries must include parent/guardian contact details and be returned to Puke Ariki or any Community Library during the (**Promotion Period**). Entries received after the Promotion Period will not be eligible for the prize draws.
- Prize draws will be held at Puke Ariki.
- The winners will be contacted by 10 February 2026. If the Council is unable to make contact with a winner after three attempts, they will be entitled to select another winner.
- The Council's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- The Council reserves the right to terminate, modify or cancel a prize draw or withdraw or substitute the prizes at any time without notice.
- The prizes cannot be transferred, exchanged or redeemed for cash.
- The Council reserves the right to use each winner's name and photograph for promotional media and publicity purposes (including the social media and website page of Puke Ariki and the Council).
- When collecting personal information, the Council complies with the Privacy Act 1993 and the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987.

The parent/guardian of an entrant must consent to these terms and conditions before the entrant can participate in the competition.
